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1. OBJECT OF THE CONTRACT

The contract concerns an Open Access Publication service of a scientific article in the journal Population Health Metrics (PHM) published by Springer Nature.

2. DESCRIPTION OF THE SERVICE

Open Access Publication service of a scientific article "*The decline of 'Deaths of Despair' in Italy: unveiling this phenomenon in a new context*" in the journal Population Health Metrics (PHM) published by Springer Nature

3. PERFORMANCE AND DURATION

The service must be completed within 15 consecutive calendar days from the date of contract signing. Delivery shall take place at the Department of Statistical Sciences, Piazzale Aldo Moro 5, 00185 Rome.

4. CONTRACT VALUE

The contract value is € 2490,00 + VAT, with zero safety charges. The offered price must be all-inclusive.

5. AWARD PROCEDURE

The service is awarded at the lowest price through direct award pursuant to Article 50, paragraph 1, letter b) of Legislative Decree 36/2023

6. GENERAL PRINCIPLES

The award procedure is prepared in compliance with the principles of free competition, non-discrimination, transparency, proportionality and publicity, pursuant to Article 1, paragraph 2, of Law No. 120/2020 as amended by Article 51, paragraph 1, letter a), point 2.1, of Decree-Law No. 77/2021, and the following principles and provisions: Article 22 "Protection of the financial interests of the Union" of Regulation (EU) No. 2021/241 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 12 February 2021 establishing the Recovery and Resilience Facility, with positive evaluation by ECOFIN Council Decision of 13 July 2021, notified to Italy by the General Secretariat of the Council with note LT161/21 of 14 July 2021;

Proper use of Next Generation EU funds allocated to the Italian National Recovery and Resilience Plan pursuant to Regulation EU 2021/24 and consequent implementation of monitoring and reporting activities of expenditures and Milestones & Targets to certify and verify the effective and efficient physical and financial progress of PNRR measures;

Decree-Law of 31 May 2021, No. 77 on “Governance of the National Recovery and Resilience Plan and initial measures to strengthen administrative structures and accelerate and streamline procedures”, converted with amendments into Law No. 108 of 29 July 2021;

Anti-corruption and conflict of interest measures implemented by Public Administrations pursuant to Decree-Law No. 80/2021, converted into Law No. 113/2021, Presidential Decree No. 81/2022 and Ministerial Decree of 24.06.2022, whereby the Three-Year Anti-Corruption and Transparency Plan was incorporated into the Integrated Activity and Organization Plan (PIAO) 2024–2026, approved by the Board of Directors of Sapienza with resolution No. 1 of 23 January 2024; Compliance with each Milestone and Target obligations indicated in the Programmatic Acts of Investment 1.4, including the scheduled contribution to the Target of the relevant Measure;

Compliance with additional requirements linked to PNRR funds, in particular the principle of “Do No Significant Harm” (DNSH), as provided by Regulation (EU) No. 2020/852 of 18 June 2020, especially Article 17 defining environmental objectives, and by the European Commission Communication 2021/C 58/01 “Technical guidance on the application of the DNSH principle under the Recovery and Resilience Facility Regulation”;

Compliance with the contribution that PNRR projects must ensure to achieve the Target associated with the reference measure, as well as the contribution to the common indicator and environmental and digital tagging, and transversal PNRR principles such as gender equality and the obligation to protect and enhance youth;

Compliance with the timelines set out in the Procedural Schedule prepared for the indicated measure;

Compliance at the Investment level with allocation constraints to climate objectives and digital transformation provided in the PNRR, pursuant to Article 18 of Regulation 2021/241, as agreed with the European Commission, with association of the relevant eligible financial progress during implementation.

7.NEGOTIATION SYSTEM

The tender procedure will be carried out entirely electronically through the UBUY e-procurement platform. The operation of the Platform complies with current legislation and, in particular, with EU Regulation No. 910/2014 (hereinafter referred to as the eIDAS Regulation – electronic IDentification Authentication and Signature), Legislative Decree No. 82/2005 (Digital Administration Code), Legislative Decree No. 50/2016 and its implementing acts, in particular the Decree of the Presidency of the Council of Ministers No. 148/2021, and the AGID Guidelines.

The use of the Platform implies the tacit and unconditional acceptance of all terms, conditions of use, and warnings contained in the tender documents, in the aforementioned document, as well as of any information communicated to users through the Platform.

The use of the Platform is governed by the principles of self-responsibility and professional diligence, as provided for in Article 1176, paragraph 2, of the Civil Code, and is regulated, among others, by the following principles:

- equal treatment among economic operators;
- transparency and traceability of operations;
- standardization of documents;
- conduct in good faith, pursuant to Article 1375 of the Civil Code;
- conduct in fairness, pursuant to Article 1175 of the Civil Code;
- confidentiality of bids and their non-modifiability once the deadline for submitting the application for participation has expired;

- free of charge.

No fee is due from the economic operator and/or the successful bidder for the mere use of the Platform.

The Contracting Authority assumes no responsibility for loss of documents and data, damage to files and documents, delays in entering data, documents and/or submitting the application, malfunction, damages, or prejudice suffered by the economic operator arising from:

- malfunctions of equipment, connection systems, and programs used by the individual economic operator to connect to the Platform;
- use of the Platform by the economic operator in a manner not compliant with the Tender Regulations and the provisions of the tender documents.

In the event of a malfunction or failure of the Platform not attributable to the aforementioned circumstances, which prevents the correct submission of bids, in order to ensure maximum participation, the Contracting Authority may order the suspension of the deadline for submitting bids for the time necessary to restore the normal functioning of the Platform and extend the deadline proportionally to the duration of the malfunction or incorrect functioning, taking into account its severity.

CLARIFICATIONS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Clarifications and communications between the Contracting Authority and the economic operator shall be managed through the same electronic platform.

Clarifications may be requested before the deadline set for the submission of tenders; responses shall likewise be provided by the RUP (Responsible for the Procedure) before the deadline.

Any amendments or additions officially made to the tender documents by the Contracting Authority, up to the submission of tenders, shall be considered an integral part of this set of rules and the related tender documentation, forming a single body of documents, and may be activated through the use of the *soccorso istruttorio* (remedial procedure) described below.

9. PRICE REVISION

Pursuant to Article 60 of Legislative Decree No. 36/2023, if during the execution of the contract there is a variation, either increase or decrease, in the cost of the goods exceeding five percent of the total amount, prices shall be adjusted to the extent of eighty percent (80%) of the variation, with reference to the main performance.

For the purpose of calculating price variations, the following ISTAT summary indices are used:

- With regard to works contracts, the summary indices of construction costs;
- With regard to service and supply contracts, the consumer price indices, the producer price indices for industry and services, and the indices of hourly contractual wages.

10. APPLIED COLLECTIVE AGREEMENT

Personnel employed in works, services, and supplies subject to public contracts and concessions are covered by the national and territorial collective agreement in force for the sector and the area in which the work is performed, concluded by the employers' and workers' associations that are comparatively most representative at the national level, and by the agreement whose scope of application is strictly connected to the activity subject to the contract carried out by the company, even predominantly.

This obligation remains in force even after the expiry of the aforementioned collective agreements and until their replacement.

The contractor who applies a different collective agreement must guarantee the same protections to workers.

The above obligations bind the contractor even if they are not a member of the signatory associations or withdraw from them, and regardless of the artisanal or industrial nature of the structure, the size of the company, or any other legal, economic, or trade union qualification, including cooperative form.

The contractor is also required to comply with and apply all rules relating to compulsory insurance and accident prevention, social security, and welfare, with respect to its employees and worker-members in the case of cooperatives.

At the request of the contracting authority, the contractor must certify the application of the remuneration provided for by the National Collective Labour Agreement (CCNL) of the sector companies and by the supplementary territorial agreements, to the workers, including worker-members in the case of cooperatives, employed in the contract.

The contracting authority reserves the right to verify, at any time, the regular fulfillment of obligations relating to the payment of mandatory contributions under the law. For the purpose of paying the contractual installment, the contracting authority verifies the contractor's compliance with such obligations. The contracting authority also reserves the right to verify, even directly, compliance with the provisions on compulsory insurance under the law.

For contributory or wage-related non-compliance, paragraph 6 of Article 11 of the Code applies.

The national and territorial collective agreement applied is: not applicable.

11. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

The economic operator shall be excluded from the procedure if any of the exclusion grounds set out in Articles 94 and 95 of Legislative Decree No. 36/2023 apply.

The operator shall also be excluded if it has assigned tasks in violation of Article 53, paragraph 16-ter, of Legislative Decree No. 165/2001.

Failure to accept the clauses contained in the Integrity Pact constitutes grounds for exclusion from the procedure, pursuant to Article 1, paragraph 17, of Law No. 190/2012.

Economic operators shall be excluded from the tender procedure if, at the time of submission of the offer, they fail to comply with the obligations regarding the employment of persons with disabilities under Law No. 68 of 12 March 1999, as well as pursuant to Article 80, paragraph 5, letter i), of the Code.

Economic operators employing more than fifty employees shall be excluded from the tender procedure if, at the time of submission of the offer, they fail to produce a copy of the latest periodic report on the situation of male and female personnel, prepared pursuant to Article 46 of Legislative Decree No. 198/2006, with certification of its conformity to the version possibly already transmitted to company trade union representatives and regional equality councillors, or, failing that, with certification of its simultaneous transmission to company trade union representatives and to the regional equality councillor(s).

Economic operators employing between fifteen and fifty employees shall be excluded from the tender procedure if, in the twelve months prior to the deadline for submission of the offer, they failed to provide the contracting authority, in relation to a previous public contract financed wholly or partly with PNRR or PNC funds, with the report referred to in Article 47, paragraph 3, of Decree-Law No. 77/2021.

For the purpose of completeness in relation to administrative checks, the economic operator must also produce the following documents:

For economic operators (EOs) with more than 50 employees (Art. 47, para. 2, Decree-Law No. 77/2021), at the time of submission of the offer, the following must always be attached:

- Copy of the latest report on the situation of personnel;
- Certification of its conformity with the version transmitted to company trade union representatives (RSA) and the regional equality councillor, or certification of its simultaneous transmission to those subjects.

For EOs employing between 15 and 50 employees (Art. 47, para. 3), within 6 months of the conclusion of the contract:

- Gender report on the situation of male and female personnel, to be transmitted to the RSA and the regional equality councillor.

For EOs employing fewer than 15 employees, the following must be attached:

- Declaration indicating this condition.

Furthermore, for operators employing between 15 and 50 employees (Art. 47, para. 3-bis, Decree-Law No. 77/2021-bis and ANAC Resolution No. 122/2022) and, pursuant to D.P.C.M. 7 December 2021, for operators with more than 50 employees, within 6 months of the conclusion of the contract, the following must be provided:

- Self-certification pursuant to D.P.R. 445/2000 by the legal representative, regarding compliance with obligations governing the right to work for persons with disabilities under Art. 17 of Law No. 68/1999 (certification obligation);
- Report on the fulfillment of obligations imposed on companies by Law No. 68/1999 and on any sanctions and measures imposed on companies in the three years preceding the deadline for submission of offers.

12. VERIFICATION OF ADMINISTRATIVE DOCUMENTATION

The RUP (Responsible for the Procedure) shall verify the timely submission of the documentation and check its completeness and compliance with the requirements set out in these tender regulations. Once the administrative documentation has been reviewed, the RUP shall proceed with the evaluation of the financial offer.

13. REMEDIAL PROCEDURE (Soccorso Istruttorio)

Through the remedial procedure referred to in Article 101 of Legislative Decree No. 36/2023, deficiencies in administrative documentation may be rectified.

In particular:

- The lack of possession of the prescribed participation requirements cannot be remedied through the remedial procedure and constitutes grounds for exclusion from the tender procedure;
- The omission, incompleteness, or irregular submission of declarations regarding the possession of participation requirements, as well as any other omission, incompleteness, or irregularity in the application, may be remedied, except in cases of false declarations;
- The absence of signatures on the required declarations and on the offer may be remedied.

For the purposes of the remedial procedure, the contracting authority shall grant the economic operator a reasonable period of time — not less than five and not more than ten days — to provide, supplement, or regularize the necessary declarations, indicating their content, the persons required to make them, and the section of the Platform where the requested documentation must be uploaded.

14. AWARDING OF THE CONTRACT AND CONTRACT EXECUTION

At the conclusion of the above operations, the RUP (Responsible for the Procedure) shall formulate the proposal for awarding the contract in favor of the economic operator.

The contract shall be executed following the completion of all necessary checks to verify that the Economic Operator meets the required qualifications.

The contract will be executed electronically.

All contractual expenses and fiscal charges, such as duties and taxes — including registration fees where applicable — related to the execution of the contract shall be borne by the successful bidder.

15. PAYMENT OF THE CONTRIBUTION TO ANAC

For this procedure, the economic operator is exempt from the contribution required by law in favor of the National Anti-Corruption Authority (ANAC), in accordance with the provisions of ANAC Resolution No. 1197 of 18 December 2019, published on the ANAC website in the section “contributions in tender procedures.”

16. GROUNDS FOR EXCLUSION UNDER ARTICLES 94 TO 100 OF LEGISLATIVE DECREE NO. 36/2023

The Contracting Authority shall verify the declarations in accordance with the procedures set out in the University Guidelines Prot. No. 60790 of 3 July 2023, as provided for by Article 52 of Legislative Decree No. 36/2023.

When, as a result of the verification, the possession of the declared general or specific requirements is not confirmed, the Contracting Authority shall proceed with:

- termination of the contract;
- enforcement of any final guarantee;
- notification to ANAC (National Anti-Corruption Authority);

17. PANTOUFLAGE CLAUSE

Under penalty of exclusion, the economic operator must declare that no employment contracts have been concluded, nor assignments granted, to former public employees in violation of Article 53, paragraph 16-ter, of Legislative Decree No. 165/2001.

The Administration reserves the right to verify the accuracy of the information contained in the declaration provided and simultaneously informs that violation of the prohibition under Article 53, paragraph 16-ter, of Legislative Decree No. 165/2001, once ascertained, will entail:

- exclusion from procurement procedures for those subjects for whom the violation has emerged under Article 53, paragraph 16-ter, of Legislative Decree No. 165/2001;
- nullity of contracts and assignments granted in violation of the prohibition, as well as of assignments conferred on the former public employee by private entities referred to in the regulation;
- prohibition for private entities that have concluded contracts or granted assignments in violation of the prohibition to contract with public administrations for the following three years;
- the possibility of legal action to obtain compensation for damages against former employees for whom violations of the prohibitions under Article 53, paragraph 16-ter, of Legislative Decree No. 165/2001 have been established;
- reporting by the Anti-Corruption Officer of the violation of the pantouflage prohibition by a former employee to ANAC and to the administration where the employee served, and possibly also to the entity where the former employee has been hired.

18.CONFLICT OF INTEREST

It is noted that there is a prohibition on awarding — through any public procurement procedure — the supply of goods and services and public works to sole proprietorships, partnerships, or corporations in which the spouse, de facto cohabitant, or relatives and in-laws up to the fourth degree inclusive of the professor or researcher (including fixed-term staff) whose research funds bear the cost of the award, are owners, partners, or hold managerial positions.

This prohibition does not apply to joint-stock companies in which the share held by the spouse, relative, or in-law is less than 5% of the share capital.

The economic operator undertakes to disclose any family ties as described above.

19.CODE OF ETHICS AND CONDUCT

In carrying out the activities covered by this procedure, the personnel involved must comply with the provisions of the Code of Ethics and Conduct adopted by Sapienza University of Rome through Rectoral Decree No. 3430/2022 (Prot. No. 107441 of 28 November 2022).

20.REGULAR EXECUTION

The Contracting Authority, through the RUP (Responsible for the Procedure), issues the certificate of regular execution within 7 days of completion of the service.

Following the issuance of the certificate of regular execution, payment of the contractual amount shall be made, without prejudice to the right of the person responsible for issuing the certificate to request any additional documentation deemed necessary.

21.PAYMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Payment for the service shall be made within 30 days of receipt of the electronic invoice through the interchange system (SDI), by bank transfer to a dedicated account, for which the Contractor is obliged to guarantee traceability pursuant to Law No. 136/2010 and subsequent amendments.

The Contractor is required to comply with all obligations set forth in Article 3 of Law No. 136/2010 in order to ensure the traceability of financial transactions related to the contract. Accordingly, the Contractor must use a bank or postal account, opened with banks or with Poste Italiane S.p.A., dedicated — even if not exclusively — to receiving payments under this contract. All financial transactions relating to the services covered by this contract must be recorded on the dedicated account and must be carried out exclusively by means of bank or postal transfer, except for the exceptions provided for in paragraph 3 of Article 3 of Law No. 136/2010.

The Awardee assumes all obligations regarding the traceability of financial flows under Article 3 of Law No. 136 of 13 August 2010 and subsequent amendments and integrations, as set out in the relevant declaration.

Failure to use bank or postal transfer, or other collection or payment instruments suitable to ensure full traceability of transactions, constitutes grounds for termination of the contract pursuant to Article 3, paragraph 9-bis, of Law No. 136 of 13 August 2010.

The Awardee undertakes to immediately notify the Contracting Authority and the Prefecture – Territorial Office of the Government of the Province of Rome of any non-compliance by its counterpart (subcontractor/sub-supplier) with financial traceability obligations.

In compliance with the provisions of Ministerial Decree No. 55/2013, the Contracting Authority accepts only invoices issued in electronic format.

22.CONTRACT AMENDMENTS

Without prejudice to the provisions regarding price revision, pursuant to Article 120 of Legislative Decree No. 36/2023, the Contracting Authority may amend the contract in the following cases:

- Due to the supervening need for supplementary services/supplies not provided for in the initial contract, where a change of contractor at the same time: • proves impracticable for economic or technical reasons; • would cause the Contracting Authority significant inconvenience or a substantial increase in costs;
- If a new contractor replaces the awardee due to one of the circumstances indicated in Article 120, paragraphs 1(d), 2, and 3 of the Code.

If, during execution, it becomes necessary to increase or decrease the services up to one-fifth of the contract amount, the Contracting Authority may require the contractor to perform under the originally agreed conditions. In such case, the contractor may not claim the right to terminate the contract.

23.TERMINATION FOR BREACH AND WITHDRAWAL

In the event of breach of contractual obligations, the Department of Statistical Sciences reserves the right to terminate the contract pursuant to and for the purposes of Article 1453 of the Civil Code, by written notice sent by registered mail with return receipt, with 20 (twenty) days' prior notice.

Execution shall be carried out in accordance with Article 122 of Legislative Decree No. 36/2023. In the case expressly provided for in paragraph 4 of the aforementioned Article 122, the operator shall

pay penalties in the amount of 1.00‰ for each working day of delay beyond the deadline of 30 calendar days from the signing of the contract.

The rights of the Department of Management to claim compensation for any damages remain unaffected in all cases.

The Department of Management also reserves the right to unilaterally withdraw from the contract at any time without any charge, with at least 20 (twenty) days' prior notice to be communicated to the Contractor by registered mail with return receipt.

In the event of withdrawal, the Contractor shall be entitled to payment limited to the services performed, according to the fees and conditions set forth in the contract.

24. PENALTIES AND CORRECTIVE ACTIONS

The Contracting Authority reserves the right to apply a daily penalty for delayed performance equal to 0.6 per mille of the net contractual amount.

Penalties are applied following formal notification by the RUP (Responsible for the Procedure) regarding proven non-compliance by the contractor. The identified non-compliances are contested in advance to the contractor, who is formally notified of the application of the penalties. The contractor has the right to oppose by submitting counterarguments within 5 (five) working days of receipt of the notification.

In the notification, the Contracting Authority specifies the reasons, the calculation, and the payment methods of the penalty due, which must in any case be made by bank transfer payable to the Contracting Authority. Should the contractor fail to make the payment, the Contracting Authority shall deduct the amount from payments due, without prejudice to the right to claim compensation for any further damages suffered as a result of the non-compliance.

The maximum overall limit for the application of penalties is 20% (twenty percent) of the net contractual amount; once this limit is reached, the Contracting Authority may not apply further penalties but may proceed with termination of the contract, without prejudice to the right to claim greater damages.

Penalties shall not be applied for delays due to force majeure or unforeseeable circumstances, which must be duly documented by the contractor.

25. JURISDICTION

For any disputes between the Parties relating to the Contract, the Court of Rome shall have exclusive jurisdiction.

26. DOCUMENT RETENTION

The Contracting Authority shall retain and make available all documents relating to the contract at the premises of the Department of Management, Via del Castro Laurenziano 9 – 00161 Rome, in order to allow verification of the regularity of the procedure, including through the AT WORK/GEA reporting system provided by the Ministry of Universities and Research (MUR).

27. CONFIDENTIALITY OBLIGATION

The Contractor undertakes to comply with the provisions of the Privacy Code (Legislative Decree No. 196/2003 as amended by Legislative Decree No. 101/2018) and subsequent regulations and measures concerning confidentiality.

The Contractor is obliged to keep confidential any data and information of the Contracting Authority that may come to their knowledge during the term of the contract. Such data must be used exclusively for purposes connected with the subject matter of the contract and may not be disclosed under any circumstances.

In particular, the Contractor must:

- maintain the strictest confidentiality regarding administrative and/or technical acts and documents, as well as any other informational material acquired during the execution of the contract;
- refrain from disclosing, under any circumstances, information obtained from the Administration during the performance of the contract, even after its expiration, unless the Contracting Authority has given prior formal consent;
- with regard to personal data acquired, be responsible in accordance with the provisions of GDPR 2016/679 and Legislative Decree No. 196/2003 and subsequent regulations and measures concerning confidentiality.

The Contractor shall adopt, within their organizational and operational structure, appropriate measures to ensure that the above obligations are strictly observed and enforced by their collaborators and employees, as well as by any third parties involved in the execution of the contract.

In the event of verified non-compliance with the obligations of this article, the Contracting Authority shall have the right to terminate the contract, without prejudice to any other action for damages.

28. PROCESSING OF PERSONAL DATA

Personal data will be collected and processed solely for the management of the tender procedure, pursuant to Article 13 of EU Regulation No. 679/2016 of 27 April 2016 (“General Data Protection Regulation”) and Legislative Decree No. 196/2003 (“Personal Data Protection Code”), as amended by Legislative Decree No. 101 of 10 August 2018, containing provisions for the adaptation of national legislation to the European Regulation.
